- *Who were the first two people to see the wounded man? What did they do and what did they have in common? How might they have justified themselves?
- *Why did the Samaritan stop when he saw the man? How did the Samaritan help the injured man? What did he lose in time, money and effort to help this man?
- *What were the dangers involved? What does this show about the Samaritan?
- *How is he different from the religious leaders?
- *What was Jesus' last question? And the expert's honest answer?
- *How can you and I "go and do likewise"?
