(Patiently correct, rebuke, and encourage people)

*Do you feel people no longer listen to sound and wholesome teaching? (Why do you think this?)

*According to verse 5 what should we do?

*Does verse 14 mean we couldn't be harmed if we are doing good? (Explain what Paul means here)

*Who is "their intimidation" in verse 14?

*How can we sanctify Christ as Lord in our hearts?
*Are you ready to tell others why you believe in Christ? Why do you?
*Has anyone asked you this before? Were you ready?
*How can we be better prepared to defend our faith?
*How should we treat those that scoff us for that faith?
*Can you give a biblical example where those who criticized a godly believer in the Bible were put to shame (16)?
